Rules

1.	The Baltimore Screenwriters Competition is open to all screenwriters.			
2.	Screenplays must be set in Baltimore or 75% filmable in Baltimore. \Box			
3.	Scripts must be written in US Motion Picture industry standard format ;			
	typed in 12pt. Courier font; printed on white paper; bound with brass fasteners;			
	cardstock covers. FEATURE FILM SCRIPTS: Approximately 85-150 pages. SHORT FILM SCRIPTS: Must not exceed 30 pages.			
4.	Each entry must consist of one hard copy and one electronic copy or three hard copies of the screenplay. Entries with less than three hard			
	copies or no electronic copy will not be accepted for consideration. Email your electronic copy in .pdf format to:

5.	To assure your scripts anonymity through the judging process, please do not put your name or other identifying information (address, script registration number, etc.) on the title page or anywhere			
	in your script.			
6.	An entry form and entry fee must accompany each screenplay.			
7.	Submissions for the 2020 Competition will not be accepted after 5:00PM ET Monday, January 13, 2020. □			
8.	Scripts under option or sold are not eligible.			
9.	Revisions and substitution of new drafts for entries received will not be accepted under any circumstances.			
10.	Two or more authors as co-applicants may submit a screenplay. Division			
	of the award will be the sole responsibility of the winners. \Box			
11.	More than one screenplay may be submitted by the same author(s). However. a srperate completed and signed Entry Form and Entry Fee			
	must accompany each submission.			
12.	The screenplay submissions must be the original work of the applicant and may not be based, in whole or in part, on any other work for which			
	the writer does not own the rights. We will not accept adaptations unless they			
	comply with the above.			
13.	Prizes are non-transferrable.			
14.	The act of signing and submitting an Entry Form constitutes acceptance without reservation of all rules and requirements of the Baltimore Screenwriters
